Linesman and Line Judge

- At the coin toss, you shall position yourself at the top of the numbers, turn and face your sideline with a ball in hand. Take a professional stance and wait for your team to take the sideline . Once the toss is over, report to the Referee and Umpire for instructions.

Back Judge

- As in the manual, if teams come out of separate end zones, the Back Judge should take his normal position with the Line Judge. Watch for unnecessary taunting from both sides as the teams take the field.

Linesman and Line Judge

- Count four in the back field. If five players are in the back field and one moves up, only the official on that side shall give signal. It can be confirmed. Wings should confirm signal before the staff.

Helmets coming off

- It is the responsibility of the Back Judge to document the play and the if he was a runner, tackler, or blocker. The crew should assist the Back Judge when documentation is recorded. The Back Judge will notify the Referee following the game with the helmet documentation. The Referee will include this in his game report.

Linesman and Line Judge

- Wingman will punch both Forward and Backward for all passes that are in their zone. Quick swing passes is where this will really come into play. Wings do not need to punch on long passes down the field. This signal is to let both the Referee and the Back Judge know if the pass is forward or backward.
